

The Center for Prevention Research at Tennessee State University (TSU) is seeking applications for a Project Coordinator for a new 5-year project funded by the National Institutes of Health. The individual hired for this position will work closely with a team of investigators from TSU, Meharry Medical College, Vanderbilt University, and Congregational Health and Education Network (CHEN) in a study that began in September 2021 called Engaging Partners in Caring Communities (EPICC). The EPICC Project is designed to expand the capacity of churches that serve African American communities to implement evidence-based health promotion programs in their congregations. The individual hired for this position will manage a range of administrative tasks, assist in coordinating the activities and timelines of the subcommittees and consultants working on the project, and serve as a member of the Core Research Team with opportunities to participate in scholarly work.

The Project Coordinator must have 1-2 years of experience which may include documented work as a student, along with a master's degree in behavioral or health sciences, such as psychology, sociology, public health, nursing, or educational leadership. Prior experience in research project management is highly desirable.
